Dear ESV;

Regarding the new Electrical Safety Regulations pertaining to the Skills Development & Maintenance component;

- Would consideration be given to those who due to their employ maintain multiple state electrical licences, in particular Queensland and Northern Territory where for years mandatory Skills Maintenance Tests (SMT) are completed upon licence renewal and where both states have a mutual agreement on SMT competency.
- This would elevate the already costly exercise of holding multiple state electrical licences, the Queensland and Northern Territory regulatory authorities have managed to achieve common ground on SMT competency would ESV consider this?

As a footnote:

Skills Development and Maintenance for electrical workers I think this is a great idea and should have been implemented Australia wide years ago, to date when renewing my Victorian, South Australian and NSW electrical licences no such Skills Development and Maintenance training refresher is required.

I hope this feedback will be of use in finalising the Electrical Safety (Registration & Licensing) Regulations 2020.
